“Introduction to Bird Watching” Birding Walk for Novices



At Woodland Regional Pond
December 2nd 8:30am to 12 pm



A short walk for those new to bird watching, or just curious about wild birds (5 yrs. and older.)

Woodland’s East Regional (Stormwater Detention) Pond is landscaped with native plants that attract both resident and migrant birds and other wildlife. The pond hosts Canada Geese, Great & Snowy Egrets, ducks and other water birds. We should also see yellow-rumped warblers, white-crowned sparrows and other small birds.

Yolo County Resource Conservation District (YCRCD) and Yolo Audubon will partner on this trip and provide access beyond the gates - an area not normally open to the public.

The path provides easy-walking and viewing. Meet at 8:15 AM at the Woodland East Regional Pond parking lot at the “T” intersection of [Rd 102 and Farmers Central Rd in Woodland](#). The trip will conclude by noon. Yolo Audubon Co-Leaders Ken Ealy & Carlos Castaneda will have binoculars to loan, but bring your own if you have them. Strong wind or heavy rain cancels. Questions?
